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Dear Freshmen Parents/Guardians,

It will soon be time to register your freshman student for the upcoming 2021-22 school year. It is important to us that you are informed of the registration process and involved in planning a program of study that supports your student's college and/or career goals.

To begin the registration process, all freshmen will participate in CHS Registration Day on February 11, 2021 by entering their 2021-22 course requests into PowerSchool. Counselors will then meet individually with each student during the weeks of February 22 - March 10 and March 15-16 to review and update his/her Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) and to review his/her course requests previously entered into PowerSchool.

The following steps are built into the registration process to help parents/guardians stay involved in their freshmen student's course planning:

- (1) Prior to CHS Registration Day, all students receive a 2021-22 registration form and are instructed to take the form home to discuss course selections and alternates with parents. Students are instructed to return these **signed** forms during CHS Registration Day on February 11, 2021.
- (2) Parents/Guardians can view their student's course requests in PowerSchool using their PowerSchool login any time after February 11, 2021.
- (3) The dates of March 15-16 have been set aside for virtual appointments for parents who wish to be included in their student's registration conference.

Should you wish to be included in your student's registration conference, please call Kay Hayes in the Counseling Office, 816-671-4080, to schedule an appointment with your student's counselor. Appointments are available during office hours from 8:00-3:00 on March 15-16.

Regardless of whether or not you are able to schedule an appointment, a school counselor will meet with your child individually to register him/her for next year. As always, feel free to call any time you have questions. We encourage our high school parents/guardians to remain actively involved in their child's education throughout all their years at Central High School.
