

Locker Room Code of Conduct

“Think for Yourself but Think of Others”

All Lincoln-Sudbury students are fortunate to have the privilege of being assigned a locker room (wellness) locker that they may use each year in high-school. With this privilege comes certain responsibilities to ensure that the locker room is a safe space for everyone and that school and personal property is respected.

The locker room is to be used for the purpose of changing and using showers/restrooms before or after wellness classes or sports. The locker room is not a place for hanging out during free time.

Responsibilities of Locker Room Use:

- 1. Treat other people and their property with the utmost respect.**
 - No physical contact (wrestling, fighting or horseplay).
 - No harassing or intimidating language.
 - If an item does not belong to you- Do not touch it!
- 2. Secure all personal items inside your locker.**
 - If a theft occurs report it immediately to your house office.
- 3. Respect our schools property.**
 - Do not damage lockers.
 - Do not write on walls, benches, lockers. etc.
 - Clean up after yourself. Properly dispose of all garbage in trash cans.
- 4. Be a leader not a follower, be an active bystander.**
 - Report any unsafe activities to a teacher or coach.
 - Remind others of the responsibilities of locker room use.
 - If someone is doing something wrong and you do nothing it is like saying that it is O.K.
- 5. At the end of each school year you must clean out your locker and leave the door open.**

Your acceptance of a locker is an agreement to adhere to and uphold the responsibilities outlined above. If you are found to be unable to do so you will lose your privilege of locker room use. Members of athletic teams may have additional responsibilities to maintain the standards of locker room conduct during the season.
